Reading

It is very important that children continue to read their home reading books as much as possible and that they also have the opportunity to <u>read aloud</u> to you. Reading is an essential skill needed for your child to access all areas of the curriculum, good readers make good writers! All children are to complete a 'reading quiz' on their completed reading book. Their results will be recorded in their Reading Record Books.

It is unusual to have no homework and at the very least all children should be reading, learning spellings and number bonds/times tables. These are personalised and all children know what spellings and number bonds/times tables they are currently learning.

BIG MATHS

Your child will work on their number skills every Friday. Please remember that the idea is that they improve on their own score each week rather than compete against each other.

PE

Swimming will be on a Thursday.

Please ensure that all children have a complete named PE kit. Trainers and tracksuits (preferably blue or black) can also be kept in school for PE lessons.
